GEC140	MISCONCEPTIONS IN SCIENCE	Assoc. Prof. Dr. Engin Baysen
<p>The aim of this course is to gain understanding of conceptions and misconceptions (myths) regarding Science, and Dentistry in particular to ease, and strengthen the communication between the dentist and their patient.</p>		

GEC214	HISTORY OF WESTERN CIVILIZATION	Prof. Dr. Slobodan Ilic
<p>The course aims to familiarize students with the historical development of the Western civilization and its main concepts from its ancient non-European origins to the modern times. Using related excerpts from literature, philosophy, and political thought, as well as chosen works of art, music and film, the students will be encouraged to develop their own critical attitude on Western civilization through free discussion and oral presentations.</p>		

FRE102	FRENCH II	Özde Demirel
<p>At this level the students work in class on communicating simple and routine tasks in order to interact with relative facility in their specific field of activities. Students are able to discuss ideas with frequently used language and can ask for information about familiar subjects concerning everyday subjects and the news. In addition, they will often be asked to produce short presentations in class. They also work on comprehension skills and writing notes and simple messages. They work on improving their grasp of everyday syntax and grammar and build a lexical base corresponding to immediate needs. They also work on targeted pronunciation to improve clarity of expression.</p>		

GEC142	EARLY YEARS NURSERY IN NURSING	Asst. Prof. Dr. Yasemin Çetereisi
<p>This course is a foundation course that prepares learners to become Early Years Educators, enabling them to work with children from birth to aged 5 years. The learners will gain knowledge in a variety of early year's settings which will support your academic studies. The learners will study a variety of areas including child development such as, language, health, key theories, nutrition, religion in early years, supporting additional needs and the importance of play.</p>		

GEC146	CULTURE IN EDUCATION AND WORKPLACE	Yağmur Raman Erkunt
<p>This course aims to provide students with an understanding of "culture as mental programming," with particular attention paid to cultural differences, intercultural encounters and their impact on education and workplace.</p>		

GEC148	COMMUNICATION SKILLS IN THE WORKPLACE	Asst. Prof. Dr. Yasemin Çetereisi
<p>This course prepares learners to use different communication strategies in the workplace. The learners will be able to describe different types of communication and how they are used in the workplace, recognize the skills required for effective communication, understand the impact that communication can have on how people are perceived by others, identify how effective communication can overcome challenges in the workplace and, reflect on current personal communication skills and how these can be developed and used more successfully. Learners will also develop written communication skills as well as spoken communication skills.</p>		

EMC101**ENGLISH MEDIA CLUB****Funda Aşardağ**

This course aims to improve learners' listening and speaking skills. The online course content is presented through YouTube videos on a time-scheduled basis, such as one or two videos per week. The course emphasizes the development of fluency and intelligibility in spoken English. Students will have a chance to participate in a variety of discussions and talk about current events and issues. Through individual and group work activities students will improve their conversational strategies and oral presentation skills. They will learn to communicate effectively explaining their ideas in an organized manner using examples and details to support their viewpoint.

GEC114**ACADEMIC READING AND WRITING****Esra İstek**

This course introduces students to the demands and conventions of academic reading and writing. It focuses on analyzing texts, building effective arguments, and using evidence and secondary source material. Instruction on the stages of the writing process, from prewriting exercises through rough drafts and revisions, forms a key part of the curriculum.

GEC116**ADVANCED WORD SKILLS****Assist.Prof. Hanife Bensen**

The course will cover spoken language: idioms & phrases verbs, discourse markers, using vague language, proverbs. Written language - words in formal letters, linking words - formal, scientific & academic English, aspects of language including prefixes, suffixes and so on. Euphemisms, range of adjectives. News & current affairs - understanding headlines and news journalism, work & finance words - business world, money markets, finance & management.
